Series/Scope and Content Note: This collection consists of material from the James Moores Ball Ophthalmic Museum. A St. Louis ophthalmologist, Ball gave most of his books to the St. Louis Medical Supply Library (catalog of the collection is included). The Museum also holds Ball's ashes in an urn. The Ball Collection is housed in 45 numbered boxes that include books, manuscripts, photographs, and art work (medical illustration). The box contents are arranged according to the accession number (Acc.#) given to each item, in ascending order. Wherever there is a corresponding number from the Ball Museum Collection (Ball#) it is also noted prior to a brief description of the item.
