The Defense Medical Logistics - Enterprise Solution (DML-ES) - LogiCole will provide fully integrated automated information system that supports medical logistics functionality including medical supply, equipment maintenance, facility management, and assemblage management. DML-ES LogiCole is the technical refreshed application replacing the Defense Medical Logistics Standard Support (DMLSS) application. Medical Logistics Information Technology (IT) solutions directly support the Defense Health Agency (DHA) and Information Operations - Health IT missions through IT solutions that integrate readiness and health to deliver: increased readiness, better health, better care, and lower cost by implementing, managing and sustaining integrated and protected information in order to ensure the right information is accessible to the right customers at the right time and in the right way.

Users of DML-ES - LogiCole will include military and Veterans Affairs (VA) medical logicians; clinical staff working in military and VA treatment facilities; combat readiness planners; trainers at Services and VA school houses to include direct contractors and government staff. The categories of individuals the personal information is collected or obtained from electronic systems include: active duty, reservist, National Guard personnel and retired military of both Department of Defense (DoD) and VA Military Treatment Facilities. Users primarily access DML-ES - LogiCole through the use of Common Access Card (CAC) and Personal Identity Verification (PIV), access credentials are stored using PIV/CAC, Single Sign On, userid and password.

DML-ES - LogiCole collects the demographic data such as contact information, personal identifier, organizational alignment, geographic, and work force information to generate user accounts for system access, workflow management for equipment reviews and approvals and DoD property accountability. The personal identifiable information (PII) data is retained until the user no longer requires access which is validated annually and or the Government property is still considered on loan. There is no defined time frame for either of these business processes as it is based on the need. The PII data is shared with DoD and Federal systems of Procurement Integrated Enterprise Environment (PIEE), Wide Area Work Flow (WAWF) for confirmation of product receipt and to facilitate payment from the respective Service/Agency Financial systems and to inform VA systems of a expenditure of products.

DML-ES - LogiCole receives and collects non-PII data to include: Medical, surgical, dental, equipment and pharmaceutical product information and product attributes; equipment maintenance actions, history and maintenance plans; building and facilities information and attributes; authorized stock and inventory balances; organizational information; and fund control points.

DML-ES LogiCole is owned/managed by the Medical Logistics Program Management Office (MedLog PMO)/Solution Delivery Division (SDD)/Program Executive Office (PEO) Medical Systems (J-6)/Defense Health Agency (DHA).

DML-ES LogiCole collects PII for authentication and administrative use. The intended use of PII collected by DML-ES LogiCole is to
