





Coast Guard Authorities at a Glance

- **Coast Guard roles: Maritime Safety, Security, and Stewardship.**
- **Title 10** USCG is an Armed Force. Aligns under the Navy in time of war or when directed by the President.
- **Title 14** Coast Guard authorities, including law enforcement.





Health Services Challenges


- Lack of an electronic health record
